1881 Census Index

Northamptonshire

As some of you know the whole of the 1881 census is being indexed by volunteers from various family history societies with assistance from the Mormon Church. A lot of the counties have now been completed and released on fiche. Two of the most awaited counties, London and Middlesex have yet to be released.

I decided to tackle the two largest Minney concentration areas first; Northants and Beds. Some of the entries made interesting reading and I have listed the Northants emtries below. Let me know if you want extracts from these two counties.

Northants

- 1) George Minney, age 29 of Burton Latimer with wife Margaret who was born in County Tyrone, Ireland. They had a daughter Susan, age 7 who was born Pennsylvania USA. No place of origin was given for George.
- 2) Charles Minney, age 17, a border (sic) in Stanwick. Occupation given as a blacksmith's apprentice. Place of birth is Little Hampton, Beds. This is probably a transcription error.
- 3) H F H Minney, age 30 of Little Houghton. His occupation is given as police constable. Claims to be born in Ipswich. I could not find him in the birth records at GRO.
- 4) Zenas Minney age 16, son of John, of Rushden. His occupation is given as 'clicker'. What is a clicker? Any ideas?

I did a sample check on some of those born prior to 1860 and found that many of them did not have a corresponding birth entry in the GRO. This makes the 1881 census index a very important finding aid.

Bedfordshire entries will appear in the next newsletter.

Books by R J Minney

My collection of books by R J is slowly growing, to date I now have; Carve Her Name With Pride, The Tower of London, Rasputin, Hampton Court, The Two Pillars of Charing Cross, Viscount Southwood & The Governor's Lady.

I have a spare copy of Carve Her Name with Pride in paperback if anyone wants it. I have also seen another copy of Viscount Southwood for sale at £4.00. This is quite a heavy book so I would have to add postage. Drop me a line if you are interested, first come, first served.

The Governor's Lady, which was published in 1951, has a short biographical note and photo of R J Minney but the photo was faded and did not copy very well. Here is the accompanying note;

"The author of *The Governor's Lady* is a novelist, playwright, and film producer whose work is known to millions throughout the world.

He was educated at King's College in the University of London, where he studied History, has lectured at a number of universities, and has broadcast in many countries.

His extensive travels include a journey to Tibet on horseback across the Himalayas. He was attached to the staff of the Duke of Connaught for the opening of India's first Parliament, and was the first to fly across India in a plane that arrived in a packing case. He has been to Malaya, most of the countries of Europe, and the United States of America, where he worked in a film studio in Hollywood.

As a journalist he was Editor of *Everybody's*, *The Sunday Referee* and *The Strand Magazine*, to which some of the most famous writers of our time contributed. The films he produced include *The Wicked Lady, Madonna of the Seven Moons, The Magic Bow* and the most artistic of them all, *A Place of One's Own*, for which Rex Whistler designed the settings. Among the many well-known stars who appeared in his pictures are Ronald Coleman, Loretta Young, James Mason and Margaret Lockwood.

Of Minney's plays, *Clive of India* (written with W P Lipscomb) ran for over a year in London and was later filmed. He is also the author of *Gentle Ceaser*, which he wrote in collaboration with Sir Osbert Sitwell. His last novel was *Bring Out the Drum*."

Intrigued by the description "...most artistic film of them all" for "A Place of One's Own" I looked up Halliwells Film Guide (11th edition) for the following entry;

A Place Of Ones Own

Great Britain 1944 (re-issued by Eros 1949) Gainsborough Pictures. Producer R

J Minney. Director Bernard Knowles. 92 minutes b/w.

"In Edwardian times, an old house is taken over by an elderly couple and their young companion is possessed by the spirit of a murdered girl. Charming little ghost story, not quite detailed enough to be totally effective. Novel by Osbert Sitwell. Music by Hubert Bath (composer of Cornish Rhapsody). Starred James Mason, Margaret Lockwood, Dennis Price and Dulcie Grey.

"A fine piece of work...gripping, marvellous, outstanding, eerie, perky, beautiful, lovely and different." - C A Lejeune.

"One comes away with an impression of elegance which has not so far been frequent in the British cinema." - Dilys Powell.

A number of Margaret Lockwood's films have recently been released on video but not this one, unfortunately.

Some of Paul Pettit's Ancestors

Paul Pettit writes...

My grandmother was baptised Emily Gertrude Minney at Yardley Hastings on 27th March 1863 and married John Alfred Pettit at Olney, Bucks on 27th December 1886. John was a publican and shoemaker at the time of his marriage and he was baptised at Olney.

According to the family he was born at the Robin Hood public house¹ and attended Clifton Reynes school. His father Thomas kept the Robin Hood for a while, he is described as "beer retailer and shop-keeper" in Kellys Directory. He later kept the Duke of Connaught in Northampton.

Emily's father was George Minney, a cordwainer who was born 8th December 1832 and baptised at Olney Independent Meeting House. He married Elizabeth Kate Morgan at Olney Independent Meeting House on the 21st April 1851. Her 3xgreat Uncle John also kept the Robin Hood and The Bull at Olney. John's wife Barbara has gone down in fame in a letter from William Cowper, the poet to his cousin Lady Hesketh dated 1st May 1786 which says "...at The Bull indeed, they keep a chaise²...the extortionate demands that the woman of The Bull even makes....her steeds are so seldom disengaged that you would find the disappointments endless..."

According to George's grandchildren he lived at Little Street, Yardley Hastings after his wife died in February 1889. He is supposed to have "got thick" with two women who were interested in his money. He made a death bed confession that he had buried all his money in a corset under a tree. Perhaps the money is still buried under a tree in Yardley Hastings.

¹Paul states that the pub has a framed history which shows David Minney as landlord 1967 - 1979.

²Chaise - a type of travelling coach.

George's parents were William Minney and Mary Ann Minney who were married at Clifton Reynes on 17th October 1832, witnesses were Samuel Minney and Joseph Luck. The only other issue that I have been able to trace is Henry born 1835. Mary, baptised at Clifton Reynes on 19th June 1808 was the illegitimate child of Martha Minney who had two other illegitimate children; Samuel baptised on 7th November 1814 and George baptised on 9th February 1817, both at Clifton Reynes. Martha died in 1862 and was buried in Clifton Reynes on 15th March 1862. She would appear to have been 76 when she died but her age was given as 77 years on the 1861 census when she was shown as "unmarried age 77".

According to my calculations the William Minney that married Mary Ann Minney is the William born at Yardley Hastings and baptised there on 15th November 1812. The reasons that lead me to this conclusion are that the witnesses were Samuel Minney and Joseph Luck, Samuel being Mary Anne's brother and Luck being a name associated with the family later on. The earliest record of a Minney at Clifton Reynes that I have found is the marriage of Samuel Minney to Martha Harrison on 19th August 1759.

Paul sent a number of colour photographs of Clifton Reynes but the office photocopier is next to useless and they did not photocopy well enough for the newsletter. The next time I am in the area I shall certainly call in for a pint at the Robin Hood. Parish register entries for Clifton Reynes appeared in July 94 and Jan 95 newsletters.

The Times

The reference library at Brighton has recently had installed computers with CD ROM. On these are several indexes, one of which is the Palmers Index to The Times 1790 - 1905. A quick search revealed five entries for Minney (I was surprised to find any). They are; George Minney, police 7.10.1854; George Minney, police 9.10.1872; George Minney, criminal 30.10.1872; S W Minney, police 26.5.1885; and G H Minney, bankrupt 25.8.1888. My next step was to obtain photocopies of the relevant entries. From 1906 onwards The Times index is still in book form and over several weeks I searched these up to 1993.I came up with a staggering 50 references, 36 of which referred to R J Minney. Some of these are from periodicals such as The Times Literary Supplement and my local library does not keep these.

I intend to publish the full entries in future newsletters. Sadly, all the early entries are of Minneys in trouble.

The Times 7th October 1854

Westminster

George Minney, aged 18, was charged with indecently assaulting Susan Williams, a little girl, aged 11 years, with intent to commit a felony.

Mr Lawrence, in the absence of Mr Parry, attended on the part of the Associate Institution for Improving and Enforcing the Laws for the Protection of Women, which had undertaken to prosecute the case.

The prisoner was committed, bail being taken, himself in 40s, and two sureties of 40s each.

The Times 9th October 1872

Westminster

George Minney, a young man, was committed for trial charged with feloniously assaulting and wounding Archibald Small, 258B (police constable), on Monday night, in Great Peter Street.

The Times 30th October 1872

George Minney, 19, labourer, was indicted for feloniously and maliciously wounding Police Constable Small, with intent to do him grievous bodily harm.

Mr Moody prosecuted; Mr Glyn defended the prisoner. The prosecutor was on duty on the night of the 7th October in Westminster, when he saw the prisoner and another man fighting. On interfering with them the prisoner deliberately drew a knife and struck him on the wrist with it.

The jury found the prisoner guilty of unlawfully wounding, and he was sentenced to 12 months hard labour.

Notice that 'the intent to harm' was not proved. Also, the case above this one involved a drunken woman who stole 1s $6d (7^{1/2}p)$ and was sentenced to 12 years! The judge said it was best she never saw her two young children again.

The Times 26th May 1885

At Worship-Street, **Spencer William Minney**, 45, bootmaker, of York Street, Bethnal Green, was brought up on remand charged with having feloniously intermarried with Sarah Estella Ascough, his wife Elizabeth Ann being then and still alive. The prisoner had been married in the first instance at the registry office, Northampton to Elizabeth Ann Adams, in April 1872. On the 9th April in the present year he married at the registry office, Hackney, Estella Ascough. He lived with her for about a fortnight, and then he left her. She instituted the present prosecution, having

discovered that the first wife was still alive and resident in the neighbourhood of Edgeware Road. Both wives were in court, and the evidence as to both marriages was complete. The prisoner, who made no answer to the charge, was fully committed for trial, bail being allowed in two sureties of £250.

I do not of the outcome and would need to make further enquiries. What is interesting apart from the amount of biographical detail, is the extraordinarily high sureties for bail.

The Times 25th August 1888

List of bankrupt adjudications

George Henry Minney of Crewe, a contractor.

I checked these Minneys against the index and was unable to connect either of the two George Minneys due to the large number of possible matches. Spencer William Minney was baptised on 15th November 1850 at Little Staughton, Beds, the son of Spencer and Elizabeth. George Henry Minney's marriage at Ellesmere was recorded in the December quarter 1863. His death was recorded in the March quarter 1924 at Nantwich.

Australian Wall Of Honour

According to the recent Family History News & Digest (Sept 95), Australia is setting up a Wall of Honour. They plan to record the name of any immigrant into any state of Australia from all countries and for any date. Apparently all you have to do is submit the name, together with where they came from, the name of their ship and the year and port of arrival. These are to be sent to Australia's Immigration Celebration, PO Box 937, Hervey Bay, Queensland 4655, with a fee of \$20.

I'll leave this to Spence & Co if they don't mind. It sounds like a good idea. Certainly makes a change from when census returns were dumped at sea because officialdom was embarrassed by the immigrant past and sought to hide it.

Bedford, Pennsylvania

There are only a few records for Minney in the USA in the 18thc and they indicate that a family(?) of Minney moved from Lebanon Township, New Jersey to Bedford County, Pennsylvania. between 1780 and 1790.

I recently found in a second-hand book shop a small booklet "A Brief History of Bedford, Pennsylvania" by Annie Gilchrist published in 1957. I have extracted some comments which help to give a feel of those early pioneering days.

"Bedford County is 40 miles north to south and 25 miles wide. The first white settlers arrived in 1732 but nothing is known of them. In 1751 a Robert Ray erected several buildings and a trading post became known as Raystown. In 1752 the land was purchased from the Indian, Chief Anonguit. The deed is still on display in the court house. Indians scalped and killed the settlers and was not resettled until 1758 when a fort was erected by the British. In 1759 the name was changed to Fort Bedford in honour of the Duke of Bedford. In 1769 American rebels captured the fort and it fell into disuse. The town was surveyed in 1761 and laid out in 1766. In 1772 there were 350 taxable persons, mainly Scotch-Irish and Germans.

First newspaper, The Bedford Gazette was established in 1805, first stage coach 1830, first railroad 1865, first bank 1814, first protestant church 1770 by Lutherans and Reformeds, first court house and gaol 1774.

Annie Gilchrist includes details of harsh punishments for criminals (pillories, whippings and mutilations) plus harrowing stories of Indian attacks and abductions.

She makes references to various documents which in the 1950s were kept by the Registrar and mentions a popular local museum in East Pitt Street. Perhaps Agnes could make some enquiries to see if there are any more useful documents available in Bedford.

Albert Minney - Died Africa 1903

At St Nicholas Church, Little Staughton on the headstone of Charlotte Minney, wife of George, there is added the death of their son Albert on 8th June 1903. He died from the effects of gelatine fumes during an exploring expedition in Central Africa. He was 31 years old.

Pam Garner has found a copy letter dated 9th June 1903 detailing the death of Albert. It was in the possession of Norma, the granddaughter of Ernest Minney. Ernest was Albert's older brother.

Dear Sir

I regret to have to report the death at 11pm last night of A. Minney from the effects of Gelatine fumes.

Minney was it appears on the day shift, and went down No. 4 shaft to blast, and after charging his holes in one drive his candle fell from the wall where he had placed it into his bag containing the other charges, and ignited the Gelatine.

After drawing the fuses he ran into the other drive in case of an explosion when the detonators went off, and then went up and blasted in No. 1 shaft.

He appeared to be all right then, and returned to No. 4 again to blast there, after which he went off shift.

After dinner, Penrose came up to report that Minney was bad and had difficulty breathing.

Mr Hicks went down and did what he could for him, but this morning about 6am a note came up from Penrose to say he had died as stated above.

Minney was able to say very little about the matter himself as he had great difficulty in speaking at all; and of course no one actually saw the occurrence, which took place about 5pm.

I will take an inventory of his effects during the day, and send anything in the nature of Jewellery etc. forward by the next mail.

The body will be buried this afternoon.

PS. I am reporting the death to Kalomo.

My map puts Kalomo in Zambia and Bulawayo is a large town in Zimbabwe.

Dorothy also included details of a family called Minner. I have not included them here because I am not certain that their surname is a variation of Minney.

Out of curiosity I checked on the index for Mary, the deaf and dumb girl and Arthur, who is missing from the 1881 census.

Mary, as far as I can tell never married and died in 1903. The death was registered in Luton. I could not find a death for her mother Ann.

Arthur was working away from home in 1881 and lodging at the house of his employer at 27 Windsor Street, Luton. He was working as a builder's labourer. I believe he died in 1927, the death was registered at St Albans. I was unable to find a marriage.



The Will of Thomas Minney of Witton

Pam Garner wrote to me in December regarding her line of Minney and the above gentleman;

"I need to ask you about Sarah's great efforts at extracting the Minney entries from Somerset House for wills and letters of admins.

On page 8 of No16 newsletter there is an extract for Thomas Minney, late of Witton. This seems to match up with your article "Thomas Minney of Witton" on page 15 of No. 13 newsletter.

Are any of the Minney lines claiming him as theirs?

If not, I would like to have a go at matching him with Thomas Minney, son of Spenser who appears in the article on Parish Poor Law Papers, page 8 of No 10 newsletter.

Our line is descended from Spenser and so is Sarah's.

Reasons for thinking he is ours;

- 1) We are looking for a George's descendants (son of Spenser)
- 2) The age fits

- 3) The area around Stoughton and Little Staughton fits in
- 4) He seems elusive enough to be ours!

Thomas would be a brother to Sarah's Joseph and our Henry."

Just to recap on the above references to previous newsletters;

A Thomas Minney was examined under the Poor Law rules on 26th November 1808 at Roxton in Bedfordshire. This Thomas claimed to be the son of Spenser and born at Staplow¹ in the parish of Eaton Socon. The parish of Wyton is referred to as a place of employment for him. He is also alleged to be the father of a 'bastard begotten on the body of Sarah Bull'. Apparently he wed her on the Friday prior to the examination.

Thomas Minney appears in the 1841 census at Witton, with I believe his daughter Mary, ages recorded under the 1841 rules as 40 and 20 respectively. This would make him a maximum of 44 when in fact it should be 54. I am fairly certain it is the right Thomas. He is a widower.

In the 1851 census entry for Witton his age is 64 and a widower, living on his own. The full address is 10 Huntingdon Road and place of birth is given as Staughton Moor, Beds.

He died on 15th July 1858 at Witton, a yeoman. Letters of Administration were granted to his grandson George Minney of Northampton.

The index has a reference to show that Thomas was a substitute under the Militia Enrolment Regulations for a Thomas Elkins. His age is given as 24.²

Sarah was buried in Witton on 10th February 1827. age 38. Thomas was buried on 18th July 1858, also in Witton.

The result of Pam's letter is that Sarah has obtained a copy of Thomas Minney's will. It reads as follows;

In Her Majestys Court of Probate The District Registry of Peterborough In the Goods of Thomas Minney, Yeoman, deceased

"This is the last Will and Testament of me Thomas Minney of Witton in the county of Huntingdon "as follows" that I give to my children George Minney and Sarah Clark their heirs and assigns both in America one third each of my personal property and the other third to be divided between my grandchildren Judia (?) Minney, George Minney and Jane Minney their heirs and assigns formerly of Witton in the county of Huntingdon and I appoint Frederick Clifton and John Wilmot both of Houghton in the county of Huntingdon to see that the furniture and money be properly distributed as herein stated - the mark of Thomas Minney X -Witness to the signing of this Will the 6th December 1857 - Ann Clark, Frances MacBride."

¹Staploe was a hamlet of Eaton Socon and was made into a parish in 1965. Staploe is adjacent to Staughton Moor.

I have looked at the index for more information with the following results;

Sarah Minney who I believe later become Sarah Clark appeared in the 1841 census at Huntingdon in the home of Joseph Woods as a servant. Her marriage was registered at St Ives, Hunts in the December quarter 1845, GRO ref 14 393.

The above grandchildren of Thomas appear in the 1841 and 1851 census returns for Witton (see newsletters January and July 1993). They are; Judith born 1835, George born 1837 and Jane born 1840. They lived with their widowed mother Frances. Also, the baptisms of Judith and George are in the 1988 IGI for Cambridgeshire under the surname variant of Menney;

Judith Menney daughter of Joseph and Frances baptised on 14th June 1835 at Chatteris, Cambs

George Menney son of Joseph and Frances baptised on 19th March 1837 at Chatteris, Cambs.

From the index we now know that Thomas Minney, son of Spencer and Ann was born around 1787. His parents were married on 12th October 1785 at Eaton Socon. He had at least two younger brothers but probably three altogether; William baptised 1788, Henry who had an adult baptism at Tilbrook in 1815, and Joseph who stated he was born at Eaton Socon around 1795.

Thomas wed Sarah Bull in 1808 and had four(?) children; Joseph, George, Sarah and Mary(?). His wife died in 1827 age 38. As to his children; Joseph had died before the 1841 census, George and Sarah had emigrated and I cannot discover what happened to Mary, if indeed she was his daughter. After 1851 his grandchildren had moved to Northampton. George appears in the 1881 census at Rushden, a shoemaker with wife Mary and children. His daughter-in-law Frances

did not give up her links with Witton as she is shown as a visitor in the 1861 census to a William Cox. Thomas died in 1858 age 71.

To take this particular line of research further I need to find Thomas Minney's marriage and hopefully this will lead to other entries which have been elusive for so long. I intend to visit Bedford Record Office in the coming months and will intensify my search at this corner of Bedfordshire.

The one useful fact about this particular line of Minneys is the use of the Christian name Spencer. It crops up time after time. I intend to list all of them in a future article.



Goode and Minney

Diane Harriman has been sent the following marriage certificate by Lyn Curtis. Although the Joseph Goode named is not the Joseph Goode she was looking for she is interested in hearing from anyone who has a Goode/Minney connection. Lyn's address is 35 Parkside Drive, Thornlie, Western

Australia 6108.

Joseph Goode, of full age, a bachelor, labourer, son of Benjamin Goode wed Hannah Minney, of full age, a spinster, a lacemaker, daughter of John Minney, a labourer, both of Yardley Hastings on 31st October 1852 at the parish church of Yardley Hastings, after banns.

Both parties signed with a cross. Witnesses were Abraham Fenton(?) and Elizabeth Whitney.

Diane also sent this piece of information from a 1987 Footprint Journal;

Census Return

The 1851 census of Yardley Hastings gave a clear picture of the village. Of 240 households 100 were of the six most common names - Underwood 23 families, 157 names; Wooding 18 families, 111 names; Minney 15 families, 96 names. Also Johnson, King and Lack.

A quick calculation by me gives an average of just over 6 members per family.

Audrey Minney

27th May 1880. The will of Audrey Minney late of Yardley Hastings in the county of Northampton, widow who died 12th April 1880 at Yardley Hastings was proved at the Principal Registry by Eliza Minney of 18 Hanover Terrace, Regents Park in the county of Middx, spinster, the daughter and the sole executrix. Personal estate under £100.

William Minney

3rd January 1882. The will of William Minney late of the town of Northampton, Gamekeeper who died 22nd November 1881 at Northampton was proved at Northampton by William Baseley, gunmaker and James Smith, painter both of Northampton, the executors. Personal estate under £300.

Henry Minney
